General Conference is the meeting of elected delegates of the global United Methodist Church which meets every four years. It is at General Conference that this gathering of people who call themselves Methodist seek God's will and purpose for this branch of the universal Christian church. This gathering composed of equal number of clergy and lay people is the only group that can speak officially for the denomination. United Methodist Christians have no pope and our bishops, district superintendents, pastors, boards, agencies and commissions, annual conferences, local churches speak only for the church in the authority from our General Conference.

Debbie and I had the joy and privilege of being there because Debbie is president of the National Association of Commissions on Equitable Compensation; which is affiliated with the General Council on Finance and Administration. Debbie's national commission serves, guides and supports the work of commissions on equitable compensation in each conference of the United Methodist Church. Her commission was at General Conference to "lobby" for legislation related to equitable compensation; which all passed. Also to run an information booth for the delegates about the resources available from the commission.

This is Debbie's commission. I tease I was there to "carry luggage and freshen drinks." General Conference for us is a wonderful, God-filled experience. For both of us the most meaningful part of General Conference is the awesome worship. The worship glorifies God and is truly beautiful and inspiring. This was our second time to attend General Conference. We were at General Conference in Tampa, Florida in 2012.




