We call this a devotion time, but that makes it sound so hard and difficult. The sunflower naturally and freely turns toward the sun. What a joy and privilege it is for us to be able to spend time each day with God. What do you do with that time? It is up to you and the Lord. But some of us spend time talking or listening or just being silent. Some of us read God's love letters to us the Holy Bible. Some of us sing or dance. In the month of August I am going to try to read through the four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John again. I am going to listen to the stories of Jesus and ask God to speak to my soul through these stories.Our little sunflower garden has several sunflowers.

One of the ways that helps me to keep my eyes on Jesus is be with other Christians. I need my sisters and brothers in order to follow Jesus. Of course I can worship and study the Bible alone that is a blessing, but God really touches my heart, mind and soul when I do those activities with other brothers and sisters. I am nurtured and grow best when I worship and learn with other Christians. Together we provide many opportunities to grow and blossom. We have worship every Sunday at 9:00 AM and 10:30 AM. We have an adult Bible study on Wednesday at 7:30 AM and Thursday at 9:30 AM every week. In September we will resume our Sunday School classes. Our United Methodist Women, Men, Youth all provide opportunities for learning and fellowship. Our music, dance, drama programs offer ways to grow together and develop and share our gifts for the glory of God.

And the King will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. ' (Matthew 25: 37-40 N.R.S.V.)" We meet Jesus and experience Him in the service of love and care to others.

So in the words of Helen Lemmel's beautiful hymn: "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in his wonderful face, and things of earth will grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace." Just as the sunflower looks to the sun may we my friends always focus our eyes on the Son of God. God bless you all!

Alaska 2016.

Two years of planning had its challenges, between our many individual activities including church, school, sports, work and family responsibilities. In addition, add family member's with medical challenges and the expectant birth of a grandchild. Phew. Preparing for any mission trip, or extended group activity requires pre planning and pre trip activities. Various training was held discussing the purpose of our mission and opportunities for team building and for group bonding. A few days of personal time, at our own expense, was planned before our mission so that we could get adjusted to cultural changes, changes in weather & altitude and to help in furthering our team building.

Our mission, as well as a trip to Alaska could be the only opportunity for any of us to participate in such an event so we made the best of it. Our trip was full of events beginning with our departure flight delayed. We sat on the airplane at BWI waiting for storms to pass. That caused a rippling affect, we missed our connecting flight, we were stuck in the Seattle airport until the next day and we couldn't get to our hotel for a good night's rest. But, we had a lot of opportunity for group bonding and a lot of coffee. Everyone got along extremely well considering their lack of sleep. Maybe it was because we had something to look forward to, a 13 hour Denali bus ride tour. A great opportunity to enjoy God's work displayed in Alaska's wildlife, great food, beautiful scenery and discussions with local residents and visitors.

Another day was spent enjoying God's work during our glacier day cruise in Seward. A beautiful day of wildlife viewing, beautiful scenery, meeting local residents, visitors and the friendship of our team members. A third day our group of 8 adults and 2 youth, spent a day in Anchorage at a native cultural festival of crafts, music and food before our next day departure to Nome.

Nome is over an hour's flight from Anchorage and consists of over 50 villages. The only way to get to Nome is by plane or dog sled. Definitely a cultural shock when you step off the plane, baggage pick up was what we remembered as a child.

Pastor Brower of Community United Methodist Church greeted us in Nome and took us to get settled in our hotel. Looking at their communities and finding out how devastating the area is for the youth and the shortages of local medical and dental staff make it hard to believe we have a third world city in our own country. Our five days of cheerful Mission Service included de-cluttering, organizing and inventorying the area behind the alter for church services, sorting through boxes and organizing thrift shop donations, sorting, inventorying and storing tubs of baby layette donations, discussions at senior group lunches, assisting in singing with seniors at the local senior home, coordinating with the Anchorage VBS teams and the local boys & girls club.

Pastor Brower gave us a great tour of the area, the local hospital and WWII remnants. Free time was spent searching for sea glass and admiring the villages along the coast with their salmon hanging to dry along the shores of the bearing sea. Stephen was also able to try his luck with Pastor Brower fishing for salmon. Our trip was a once in a lifetime event enjoying great friendship, sharing God's love and doing what Jesus asks us to do, to help those less fortunate.
